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## Volunteering and community action

The community response across the borough to the call for volunteers to fight the Corona Virus has been truly outstanding.

The Council is currently busy mapping out what support community groups and charities need and signposting volunteers to them. This is very much an ongoing process as vulnerable residents are going to increasingly need support over the community weeks and months.

We are now launching a new campaign to support and encourage people to be a good neighbour. As more people are now self-isolating and the Government guidance is for people to stay at home, apart from a few exceptions, there is a growing need to focus on what we can do in our neighbourhoods.

## Volunteering and community action

### **NHS Volunteering**

People can now sign up to <u>NHS Volunteer Responders</u> which is supporting the NHS during the COVID-19 outbreak.

Responders will help the one and a half million people most at risk from the virus to stay well. Once you've registered and checks are complete you will be provided with a log in to the GoodSAM Responder app. Switch the app to 'on duty' and you'll see live and local volunteer tasks to pick up in your area.

### Closure of Council-owned play areas and advice for using parks and open spaces

Following the Government's announcement on 23 March Cheshire West and Chester Council has closed all its play areas.

Leader of the Council and Cabinet Member for Wellbeing, Councillor Louise Gittins said: "Our parks and open spaces remain open for exercise once a day as advised, but visitors should follow social distancing advice and stay at least 2m (6ft) away from other people.

"The Government has also stopped public gatherings of more than two people, except for members from the same household. The police have powers to enforce this, including fines and dispersing gatherings of more than two people.

"I hope our parks and open spaces will be used appropriately to provide much-needed fresh air for many people, as we all take the necessary action to help beat the Coronavirus."

# New £2.4 million hardship fund will help west Cheshire's vulnerable residents

Cheshire West and Chester Council has secured £2.4 million to help reduce council tax bills for vulnerable residents. The Government has confirmed that the Council will be allocated the money from its hardship fund to support residents struggling financially because of the impact of COVID-19.

Councillor Carol Gahan, the Council's Cabinet Member for Legal and Finance, said: "During these truly unprecedented times we want to help our residents as much as we can.

This hardship fund will help us to ease money worries for some of the most vulnerable households in the borough as we all work together to battle the spread of this disease.

Scheme will receive up to £150 off their bill. This amount will be automatically deducted. Eligible residents will receive information about how this will affect their payments soon.
